



Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre Strategy 2024-2026

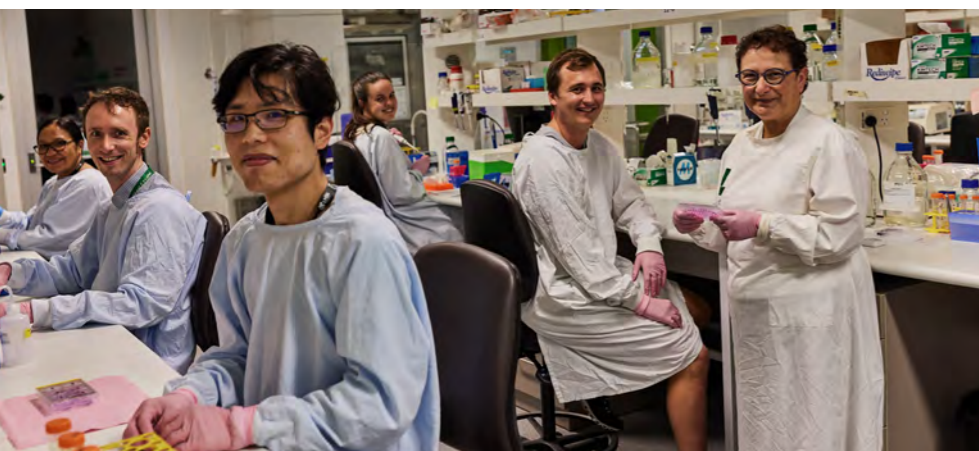
Minderoo Children's Comprehensive Cancer Centre (MCCCC) signals a new era of hope for kids with cancer. Australia's first dedicated children's comprehensive cancer centre, the MCCCC promises to deliver tomorrow's care today — transforming experiences and outcomes for children and young people with cancer.

MCCCC builds on a strong history of collaboration. Children's Cancer Institute and the Kids Cancer Centre (Sydney Children's Hospitals Network) share an almost 40-year history of working together to translate laboratory discoveries into clinical trials and medical care. MCCCC maximises the potential of this collaboration by bringing together the Children's Cancer Institute, Kids Cancer Centre and University of New South Wales in a formal partnership with a shared strategy and co-located in a purpose-designed building. Together we will improve outcomes for children and young people with cancer, by transforming the cancer journey from diagnosis through treatment and into survivorship.

Australia's first children's comprehensive cancer centre, MCCCC will include:

- a 900-strong community of dedicated child cancer professionals: clinicians, scientists, and allied health workers
- state-of-the-art technologically advanced wet and dry laboratory spaces
- education, training and research spaces
- new inpatient units designed with a child and family focus
- a new outpatient treatment centre with capacity to deliver a range of therapies now and into the future.

Our inaugural strategy represents a commitment by our partnering organisations to accelerate, integrate and magnify transformational improvements to child cancer care. Together we can deliver far greater benefits than we possibly could alone. Through our interdisciplinary and collaborative ecosystem, our community of researchers, scientists, clinicians and educators will improve children's cancer outcomes at an accelerated pace to end the burden of cancer for kids and young people across Australia.
